Where do solar panels come from?

Many of the most successful solar panel manufacturers in the world come from China, including LONGi, Jinko, Trina, and Canadian Solar (despite the name).

How long do solar panels last?

These brands produce a sizable portion of the solar panels used in the United States, and are used in everything from huge utility-scale solar installations to small home rooftop solar panel systems. To be clear up front, solar panels from the companies listed below are excellent performers with at least 25 years of expected life.

Why should the US focus on domestic solar production?
