Solar panel batteries, which store excess energy for later use, typically have a lifespan of 5-15 years. The depth of discharge (DoD) plays a significant role in determining battery life. Batteries with a higher DoD tend to last longer because they are less stressed during each cycle.

How much do solar panels deteriorate a year?

The National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) has been tracking degradation rates for the last several years as part of its Photovoltaic (PV) Lifetime Project. NREL's findings indicate that solar panels have an average degradation rate of 0.5% per year.
