Truckload freightis best for smaller or residential solar panel transportation, while flatbed freight is ideal for larger solar panels going to farms and commercial properties. The choice of solar panel transportation method will depend on the size and quantity of solar panels, as well as the final destination.

How much does it cost to ship solar panels?

However, for a rough example of how much it might cost, to freight ship one pallet of solar panels (24-32 panels) from a warehouse located in California, it would cost approximately \$200 to ship to a location in the west coast and up to \$700 to the east coast.
