#### Where is Jiaoshan Great Wall located?

Jiaoshan Great Wall is located about 3 km (2 mi) from Shanhaiguan ancient city. It is named after Jiaoshan Mountain, which is the highest peak to the north of Shanhai Pass and also the first mountain the Great Wall climbs up after Shanhai Pass. Therefore Jiaoshan Mountain is noted as " The first mountain of the Great Wall".

### What is Jiayuguan overhanging Great Wall?

Jiayuguan Overhanging Great Wall was an integral part of the ancient defense system at the Jiayuguan Pass,made of graves and yellow earth by tamping.

## How tall is the Ming Great Wall?

One of the most striking sections of the Ming Great Wall is where it climbs extremely steep slopes in Jinshanling. There it runs 11 km (7 mi) long,ranges from 5 to 8 m (16 ft 5 in to 26 ft 3 in)in height,and 6 m (19 ft 8 in) across the bottom,narrowing up to 5 m (16 ft 5 in) across the top.

#### Where did the Ming wall go?

The Ming wall extended from the Yalu River in Liaoning Province to the eastern bank of the Taolai River in Gansu Province, and winded its way from east to west through today's Liaoning, Hebei, Tianjin, Beijing, Inner Mongolia, Shanxi, Shanxi, Ningxia and Gansu.

# When was the hanging Great Wall rebuilt?

The Overhanging Great Wall in the picture was rebuilt in 1987. The Overhanging Great Wall Military Defense System Area comprises the Hanging Great Wall on the steep ridge, the Water Gate in the valley, and the Ancient Weaponry Exhibition. You can see austere panoramas from the Suspended Great Wall.
