

# Idioms about using wind to generate electricity

## What are wind idioms?

The wind idioms are - Now here are the wind idioms with meanings and examples. 1 - If something is a breeze, it is very easy to do. Example - The exam was a breeze and she got high marks. 2 - A person who is a bag of wind or a windbag talks too much and often talks nonsense.

### How is wind energy generated?

Wind power is usually generated using a wind turbine. Wind turbines are mechanical systems that convert kinetic energy into electrical energy. Kinetic energy is energy that comes from movement. Wind is the movement of air. There are wind turbines on land and in water. Shown is an animated GIF of a wind turbine rotating in blue sky.

## What does get wind mean?

1. informal A hint, suggestion, or rumor about something. Used especially with the verb " get. " We've gotten wind that our competitors are working on some new kind of smart screen technology. Don't let the boss catch wind of what you're doing, or you'll be fired for sure! 2. informal Intestinal gas; flatulence.

## What does it mean to run like the wind?

When you move or run like the wind you simply move fast and with agility, perhaps appearing to vanish from sight. "That runner was moving like the wind today." "You'd better run like the wind, otherwise you'll miss your train." Check out some more walking and running idioms for other ways to describe this kind of motion.

### What does it mean to beat the wind?

3 - To beat the wind is to continue doing something that will never succeed or result in the way you want it to. Another wind idiom with the same meaning is to cast stones against the wind. Example - He is beating the wind trying to ask her out, she will never go out with him.

### What does it mean if the wind knocks you out?

Sometimes, a strong blow to the chest or stomach can wind you or knock the wind out of you, meaning you have difficulty breathing for a while. Experiencing a shock or receiving some awful news may also cause you to become breathless, feeling like you have had the wind knocked out of you, and this is how we use the expression as an idiom.

The science behind how wind turbines generate electricity is based on converting the kinetic energy of the wind into mechanical energy, and then into electrical energy, through the use of specially designed rotor blades, hub and generator.
