What is the Museum of Broadcast Communications?

We design and support exhibits, curriculum and programs to serve as a bridge between producers, consumers, academics and students. The Museum of Broadcast Communications was founded in 1982 and opened to the public in June 1987 at the River City at 800 S. Wells St. It remained there until June 1992, when it moved to the Chicago Cultural Center.

When did NBC Radio City start?

The building houses the NBC television network headquarters, its parent NBCUniversal, and NBC's flagship station WNBC (Channel 4), as well as cable news channel MSNBC. The first NBC Radio City Studios began operating in the early 1930s. Tours of the studios began in 1933, suspended in 2014 and resumed on October 26, 2015.

Which public radio stations have a cultural and entertainment program?

Public radio distributors such as Public Radio International (PRI) and local public radio stations such as WBEZ in Chicago have also created a number of cultural and entertainment programs, including quiz shows, cooking shows, and a host of local public forum programs.

Is the National Radio Hall of Fame open to the public?

(Technically, the National Radio Hall of Fame gallery, located on the second floor of the museum, had been open to the public since December 1, 2011.) The pre-opening ceremony on June 12 included actors John Mahoney (*Frasier*) and Betty White (*The Golden Girls*) and newscaster Hugh Downs (*20/20*).

Did AT&T have a microwave relay system?

The microwave relay system was part of the AT&T Long Lines network, which included wire and cable connections. 99pi fan and Long Lines aficionado Corey Carlson explains that "the Long Lines network relayed analog data from one horn to another, with polarization of radio waves to expand the signal capacity."

What's going on with low-power TV stations in Knoxville & Greenville?

On Monday, paperwork was submitted for regulatory approval regarding a pair of deals involving low-power television stations in Knoxville; Terre Haute, Ind.; and Greenville, S.C.; from Jeff Winemiller's Lowcountry 34 Media to HC2 Station Group. Now, a third deal has been filed with the FCC.
