How does a roof bracket work?

One panel is connected across the ridge to an inverter on the other side. The mounting brackets hold the rails to the roof. There are different kinds of brackets intended for different types of roofing material. Usually, the bracket is secured to a roof truss with a bolt piercing the roof membrane.
