



The community's own solar power generation

What is community solar?

The U.S. Department of Energy defines community solar as any solar project or purchasing program, within a geographic area, in which the benefits flow to multiple customers such as individuals, businesses, nonprofits, and other groups. In most cases, customers benefit from energy generated by solar panels at an off-site array.

What is a community-owned solar project?

Community-owned solar: A solar project that is wholly owned by local members of a community. Power purchase agreement (PPA): A long-term electricity supply agreement between an electricity producer and an electricity consumer. Project host: The owner of the site where the community solar project will be located.

Can community solar power 5 million households by 2025?

This guide provides strategies and solutions that have been demonstrated by projects and programs recognized by the Sunny Awards. It provides a blueprint to help power the equivalent of five million households with community solar by 2025.

Why do communities want a community solar project?

Communities may be interested in a community solar project for a variety of reasons, including wanting to reduce pollution in their community, wanting more control over their energy sources, wanting to participate in the financial benefits of clean energy, and/or wanting more jobs or economic development through locally sited clean energy.

Who is involved in a community solar project?

Community solar products may also include nonfinancial benefits, such as environmental benefits (e.g., renewable energy certificates). There are always at least four actors in a community solar project: the host, the sponsor, the utility, and the subscribers. The host is the owner of the location where the community solar project will be located.

Can community solar projects save money?

Community solar projects and programs can increase household savings for their subscribers. The 2022 Sunny Awards required that projects provide at least 20% electricity bill savings.

A community solar project, farm or garden is a solar power installation that accepts capital from and provides output credit and tax benefits to multiple customers, including individuals, businesses, nonprofits, and other investors. Participants typically invest in or subscribe to a certain kW capacity or kWh generation of remote electrical production. The project's power output is credit...
